At 5 p.m. the Club will honor members at a punch and hors d'oeuvres reception. At this time, past Club Presidents and Directors of the Foundation will be introduced.





International String Competition, received both the grand prize and first prize awards at the WAMSO

Competition on January 15, 2012. Lipman is only the eighth grand prize winner in the fifty-six year history of the competition, a distinction that can only be given by the Minnesota Orchestra conductor, Osmo Vänskä. He also received an honorable mention at the 2011 Primrose International Viola Competition and is a recipient of a Career Grant from the Rachel Elizabeth Barton Foundation. An avid chamber musician, Matthew has performed with the Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center. He has collaborated with such prominent artists as Itzhak Perlman, Ani Kavafian, Ida Kavafian, and Paul Katz, and has performed in master classes for violists Pinchas Zukerman, Kim Kashkashian and Roberto Diaz.

Matthew is currently a second-year undergraduate student at the Juilliard School, where he studies with Heidi Castleman and Misha Amory. During his first year at Juilliard, he was named principal viola of the Juilliard Orchestra and runner-up of the Juilliard Concerto Competition. Matthew performs on a 1700 Matteo Goffriller viola, on generous loan from the Rachel Elizabeth Barton Foundation.

ellist Stéphane Tetreault, who was a semi-finalist in the 2009 Johansen International String Competition, was recently given the use of the 1707 "Countess of Stainlein, Ex-Paganini " Stradivarius, that was

once owned by Nicolò Paganini and more recently by Bernard Greenhouse, a founding member of the Beaux Arts Trio. Mr. Greenhouse played the cello

for over half a century. After his death last year, the instrument was sold in January, 2012 for over \$6 million to an anonymous patroness of the arts from Montreal, who then arranged for the generous loan. Stéphane was the youngest participant - personally selected by Michael Tilson Thomas to participate in the YouTube Symphony Orchestra, which performed at Carnegie Hall in New York. He was recently named Révélations Radio-Canada 2011-2012 in classical music. In 2012, Stéphane will appear as soloist with l'Orchestre Métropolitan, the Malaysian Philharmonic Orchestra, and the Nouvel Ensemble Moderne (NEM). In October 2011, he shared the stage with the violinist and conductor Maxim Vengerov for I Musici de Montréal's gala concert - a performance which garnered great critical acclaim.

Stéphane is currently pursuing a Bachelor's degree in music at University of Montréal where he studies with Yuli Turovsky. ❖

Route 7/Leesburg Pike/King Street. Cross Route 7 - street name changes to Beauregard Street. Follow N. Beauregard Street one long block to light. Turn right onto West Braddock, the entrance to NOVA. Schlesinger Hall is on the right.

From Falls Church:

Go east on Route 7/Leesburg Pike (toward Alexandria). Turn right onto N. Beauregard and turn

right at the first stoplight onto West Braddock, the entrance to NOVA. Schlesinger is on the right.

BY BUS:

Metro route 25A - Ballston services the N. Beauregard Street and West Braddock Road stop. Route 25A - No Va Comm Coll/Alex services the N. Beauregard St. and Seminary Road stop.

There is a 4-level parking garage adjacent to Schlesinger with two entrances: one from N. Beauregard Street and one from West Braddock Road. Parking meters are located at levels 1,2, and 3 in the garage lobby. Meters accept quarters, one-dollar bills, and five-dollar bills only. It is recommended one arrive at least 30 minutes prior to the start of the event to avoid lines at the meters. ❖



18th St. S, which gets you to the Club, comes into S. Glebe Rd from the north a short distance west of the intersection with 395 and just east of where Walter Reed Dr. crosses S. Glebe. Be aware: 18th St S. and 17th Rd S overlap where they meet Glebe and the street sign says 17th.

From 95/495:

- 1. Take 395 to Exit 7B (North Glebe Road).
- 2. Stay on Glebe Road for about ½ Mile and make a Right Turn on to 17th Rd S. (which is also 18th St at that point).
- 3. At the split shortly thereafter, bear to the Right, which will be 18th Street and is a residential area.
- 4. Stay on 18th Street as it will become the entrance to Army Navy Country Club.
- 5. The Clubhouse is straight ahead.

From Washington

- 1. Cross the 14th Street Bridge and follow the Signs for 395 South.
- 2. Stay on 395 until Exit 7 (Glebe Road). Exiting 395 South, stay in the Right Exit Lane and go to the Traffic Light.
- 3. At the Traffic Light make a Right Turn on to Glebe Road.
- 4. Stay on Glebe Road for about ½ Mile and make a Right Turn on to 17th Rd S (which is also 18th St S. at that point.).
- 5. At the split shortly thereafter, bear to the Right, which will be 18th Street.
- 6. Stay on 18th Street until you see entrance to Army Navy Country Club.
- 7. The Clubhouse is straight ahead.

From Points West (McLean etc)

- 1. Make your way to S. Glebe Rd going toward 395.
- 2. After you pass the intersections with Columbia Pike and Walter Reed Dr, take the next Left onto 17^{th} Rd $S/18^{th}$ Street S.
- 3. At the split shortly thereafter, bear to the Right, which will be 18th St—a residential area.
- 4. Stay on 18th Street until you see the entrance to the Army Navy Country Club.
- 5. The Clubhouse is straight ahead.
