# Video Audition Applications Now Accepted Year-Round

Applicants for Solo or Chamber Performance Membership now have the option of submitting video auditions at any time throughout the year. Beginning in the 2018-2019 season, applications for video auditions will be accepted and judged on a rolling basis. Our judges will review these auditions at their convenience, and new performance members will be accepted year-round. We will also continue to hold in-person auditions twice a year, if applicants prefer that option. In the past year, half of all applicants requested video auditions; many have been musicians just starting their graduate studies or careers in the Washington area and they've had videos suitable for audition already prepared. We anticipate that this new process will enable more musicians to audition for solo and performance membership, ease scheduling constraints that performers and judges experience, and encourage young performers to apply.

Details about the new virtual audition process and video requirements, as well as application information, repertoire requirements, and dates for the 2018–2019 in-person auditions are posted on the FMMC website at finmc.org/auditions. If you have been considering auditioning for Chamber or Solo Performance status, perhaps this new process will encourage you to take the plunge. Please let your musician friends know about our solo and chamber performance program, and how they can participate! •

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# From the Foundation Director

For those of us involved in the Foundation, summer doesn't really start until after the close of the Washington International Competition (WIC), which this year meant not until June 25th. But the late start to summer was well worth it. This year, WIC was honored to have an especially gifted group of string players entering the competition.

We did not envy the judges who had to choose among the gifted semifinalist string players. Somewhat exceptionally, we ended up with seven finalists, 3 violinists, 2 violists, and 2 cellists. Faced with further difficult decisions, the judges decided not to send any of them home with less than a third place finish. We ended up with our usual first prize in each instrument, Youjin Lee in violin, Muriel Razavi in viola, and Tony Rymer in cello. However, second and third prizes were each shared with two competitors: Second prize was split between Maya Buchanan, violin, and Zhanbo Zheng, viola: third prize was split between Felicitas Schiffner, violin, and Zhihao Wu, cello. Youjin Lee also won the special audience prize.

We are very grateful for our gracious and caring judges, Dmitri Berlinsky, Paul Katz, and Rita Porfiris; our truly outstanding team of accompanists, Hui-Chuan Chen and Joy Schreier; and our host families and volunteers who made all of this possible.

After our somewhat curtailed summer break, we now move on to preparations for



our 2019 Voice Competition, which will take place next May 25-26, 2019. And as we start the season we welcome our new Foundation Board members Ruth Doherty, Janice Rosen, and Carol Sikkelee and look forward to their participation in the months ahead.

I encourage you to start checking the FMMC Foundation website, www.fmmcfoundation.org, on a regular basis if you haven't been doing so already. Starting in the fall there will be an outstanding array of concerts showcasing last March's JIC winners. Leading off on Sunday, September 30th at 3:00 PM, first-place violinist Julian Rhee will play the Tchaikovsky violin concerto with the Avanti Orchestra. On Sunday, October 7 at 5:00 PM, all four JIC first-place winners will perform at the Church of the Annunciation with Frank Conlon at the piano.

In addition to Julian, vou will hear Beatrice Chen, viola, and the two young men who split the first-prize for cello, Michal Balas and Krzysztof Michalski. Both concerts are free and open to the public. Come, bring friends, and get the fall concert season off to a great start! 4

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# Avanti Orchestra Launches Season by Welcoming Julian Rhee, Johansen Competition Winner

Avanti Orchestra of the Friday
Morning Music Club begins its
2018-2019 season on Saturday, September
30, at 3 pm, at Montgomery College's
Cultural Arts Center, Silver Spring,
MD. Conductor Pablo Saelzer and the
orchestra will present violinist Julian
Rhee performing Tchaikovsky's Violin
Concerto. Also on the program are
Rossini's Overture to L'Italiana in Algeri
and Kodály's Dances of Galánta.

Mr. Rhee, 18, is the first-prize winner of the 2018 Johansen International Competition for Young String Players. Recently he has earned major awards including Finalist Winner of the 2018 National YoungArts Foundation, the 2018 Pablo Casals Prize for the Best Performance of Solo Bach, the 2018 Allen R. and Susan E. Weiss Memorial Prize for the Best Performance of the Commissioned Work, the Elaine H.

Klein Second Prize Award at the 2018 Irving M. Klein International String Competition, and winner of the 2018 Aspen Music Festival Violin Concerto Competition.

Mr. Rhee debuted at age 7 with the Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra, then the Madison Symphony Orchestra at age 10, and the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra at age 15. In 2017, he toured Argentina and Uruguay as the guest soloist performing the Brahms Violin Concerto, appeared with the Wisconsin Chamber, La Crosse, and West Suburban symphony orchestras, among others. In addition to Avanti Orchestra, upcoming engagements include performances with the Wisconsin Philharmonic Orchestra, San Jose Chamber Orchestra, and

Piedmont Center for the Arts and Eugene Symphony Orchestra.

As a chamber musician, Mr. Rhee's performance on violin and viola earned him and his string quartet First Prize at the Rembrandt Chamber Players Chamber Music Competition, Grand Prize at the A.N. & Pearl G. Barnett Chamber Music Competition, and Silver Medal at the St. Paul National String Quartet Competition. They also won the Junior String Division of the M-Prize International Chamber Arts Competition, and the Gold Medal in the Junior String Division of the Fischoff National Chamber Competition.

Mr. Rhee studied with Almita and Roland Vamos and Hye-Sun Lee as a scholarship recipient at the Music Institute of Chicago's Academy. He attends New England Conservatory studying with Miriam Fried.
