Thank you for putting your trust in me to lead, and giving me the opportunity to work with two outstanding Boards - the Board of Governors and the Foundation Board.

Please plan to attend our May Membership Meeting and Luncheon. There is a lot to discuss, as well as new officers and honorary members to be voted in. Come and get together with old friends and meet new ones. The guest speaker this year will be Peter Russell, General Director of Vocal Arts DC and there will be a lovely musical program put together by Albert Hunt. As a reminder, the meeting will be held on Friday, May 10th, 2019, at the Chevy Chase Club; 10:00 a.m. annual meeting, 11:30 a.m. reception, 12:00 noon buffet luncheon. In October 2017 the FMMC chorale traveled to Hamburg, Germany, and Vilnius, Lithuania, where

they performed Paul Leavitt's glorious Requiem with local chorales and symphony orchestras. Large audiences in Hamburg and Vilnius loved these performances and chorale members had a great time in both countries.

At the chamber music series at Calvary Baptist Church in October 2017 and 2018, members and guests enjoyed Presidential Receptions following the opening concerts—a great boost to attendance. Another boost to attendance were the Holiday Receptions held following the last concerts of the fall season.

In December 2017, Pat Geyser, an experienced advisor to nonprofit organizations, led the Board in an all-day session to discuss Strategic Planning issues. A report of this meeting was presented to the Board of Governors in June 2018. As a result of this planning session, the Club recently hired our first-ever full time Managing Director, Jennie Weyman, who reported for duty March 20, 2019, and will be working on streamlining administrative tasks, fundraising, recruitment, and public awareness. We are also very lucky to have our own Joanna Taylor working very hard on administrative tasks previously done by Suzanne Stevenson, who resigned.

We have taken the opportunity forced on us by the resignation of our webmaster Robert Wade to seek out a web contractor to develop a new FMMC website. Thanks to a committee headed by Charles Mokotoff we

Finally, after 22 years of service to the Club as Treasurer, Jo-Ann Royer resigned due to the growth of her private practice. Thank you, Jo-Ann, for all your years of dedication to the Club. Ross-Roberts High School Competition for Woodwinds, Brass, and Percussion

he Ross-Roberts High School Competition for Woodwinds, Brass, and Percussion had a record-breaking turnout for the March 23, 2019 event, held in the Chapel of the Presidents at the National Presbyterian Church, 4101 Nebraska Avenue, NW, Washington, DC.

Seventeen students registered for the competition. Mr. Stephen Roberts, Honorary Member of Friday Morning Music Club (Associate Bass/Baritone), who generously sponsors the Ross-Roberts Competition, attended. He noted that most of the previous competitions involved fewer competitors, and it was gratifying to see such a large turnout of very talented musicians.

The repertoire required pieces from three different periods, one being from the 20th or 21st century, one being performed unaccompanied, and at least one being memorized. The competitors' chosen repertoire ranged from baroque sonatas to contemporary pieces that included extended flute techniques with multiphonics. The list of instruments appearing on this year's program included flute, oboe, clarinet, bassoon, alto sax, French horn, and euphonium.

Judges were Mark Simon (DMA composition, clarinet performance), Susan Brockman (MM in flute performance), and Wendy Chinn (MM in horn performance).

The performances reflected highly developed artistry and poise, and were extremely competitive. We congratulate the following winners:


WIC Updates on Winners

At a recent Board of Governors meeting, three individuals were nominated for Honorary Membership in the FMMC and were unanimously approved by the Board. There will be a formal presentation at the Annual Membership Meeting and Luncheon on May 10.

The first to be honored is Anna-Stina Ericson, a long-time member, who has an impressive history of volunteer service in the Club. She is to be commended for invaluable support and dedication to FMMC and its members.

After joining the Chorale in 1985, she served as its librarian. She now holds the title "Librarian Emerita." She has served on many committees, including the Sumner School Concerts Committee, FMMC Long-Range Planning Committee, Nominating and Membership Committees, committees for Public Relations, Concerts in Schools, and the Club's 125th Anniversary Committee. For the Board of Governors, she held office as Recording Secretary, Yearbook Editor, and Third-Vice President for Student Activities. Finally, she has been the FMMC's diligent and invaluable Coordinator of Ushers for the Friday concert series at Calvary Baptist Church. Letters of support were received from Olivia Adler, Jeongseon Choi, and Lois Jones.

The second individual to be honored is Leslie Luxemburg, who served as Competition Chair for the Washington International Competition (2011-2013) and for the past six years has served as Director of the FMMC Foundation, Inc. that sponsors the Washington International Competition. A respected singer/ musician, Leslie has been lauded for strong guidance and leadership while overseeing the myriad details of the WIC. She has been commended for "masterfully managing financial matters including responsible fundraising, negotiations with the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts, working with competition judges, and follow-up engagements for competition winners. One sponsor has included

the following: "...the FMMC Foundation has been most fortunate to have Leslie as Director...she is incredibly competent, dedicated, and generous with her time and talent and has brought the WIC to a highly respected level among international competitions." Letters of support were received from Frank Conlon, Katie Katinas, and Louise McClelland Urban.

The third honoree is Paul Silverman, whose volunteer service to FMMC and the music community at large makes him eminently qualified for this honor. Dr. Silverman has been involved with the Johansen International Competition for Young String Players since its inception in 1997. He has worked tirelessly with every aspect of the competitions, starting with the semi-finals and continuing with winners performances. He helped the Johansen International enter the digital world so it could develop applications online, and he has monitored preliminary auditions to verify accurate video taping

of applications. As a clinical psychologist, Dr. Silverman has assisted competitors with anxiety fears before performances. In addition, he has assisted the Washington International Competition judges for the past 10 years with the important task of timekeeper.

For the community, he has been certified as producer and director for Montgomery County Public Access TV channel and producer of "Classical Open Stage" that showcases young musicians. One of the founders of the orchestra at the Rockville Jewish Community Center (JCC), he was a member of the string (cello) section from 1970–1985. He currently serves on the board of "Artists of Excellence" concert series at JCC. Letters of support were received from Leslie Luxemburg, Constance Milner, and Judith Shapiro.

All three exemplify the mission of FMMC to "promote musical culture among its members and in the community." For their extraordinary service to music and to musicians, they will receive Honorary Membership in the FMMC.
