## FMMC's Annual Luncheon

early 50 members came together at the DACOR Bacon House on F Street NW for our much-postponed annual luncheon. FMMC President Leslie Luxemburg hosted the lively event, which featured several speakers interspersed with two delightful musical performances. The guest speaker was Anne McDonough, Deputy Director of the DC History Center, with whom FMMC worked extensively in late 2020 to gather historical information from our FMMC archives housed at the Center. Ms. McDonough described the important work of the Center and spoke of similarities between our two organizations, both having been founded in the late 1800s. Our newest Honorary Members, mezzo-soprano and DC native, Denyce Graves, and FMMC's Avanti Orchestra Conductor and Music Director, Pablo Saelzer, personally accepted their awards at the luncheon. Ms. Graves, who could not attend, had videotaped a heart-felt statement to thank FMMC for all it has done to encourage young people interested in classical music, reaching back to her own memories as a

Mr. Saelzer spoke of his gratitude to FMMC for providing the resources he needs for the orchestra and for supporting his programming choices. He also gave a nod to Paul Leavitt, Arioso Chorale Conductor, for the Chorale's advances over the past few years. Mr. Leavitt later delivered a moving tribute to FMMC violinist Barbara (Bobbie) Gholz, who recently retired from years of service as the Arioso Chorale Orchestra's concertmaster. The musical performers included pianist and Foundation Director Grace McFarlane Botellier, who played several lovely pieces on an historic piano set up in the luncheon space. Student clarinetist Krystal Wu and FMMC pianist Jeongseon Choi amazed the audience with a rendition of Luigi Bassi's challenging Concert Fantasia on motives from Verdi's opera Rigoletto. 🥠

Who would have imagined that after 22 months of being forced to cancel or modify concerts and competition formats, we still would face uncertainty about future events planned for our organization? After the many challenges brought on by the COVID pandemic of 2020-21, it's time to turn the page as we approach the new year. With the advent of vaccines and therapeutics, there is much to look forward to, with hope and expectation.

What a thrill it was to get back, *LIVE*, into the concert hall to celebrate the successful debut of Vivian Chen, pianist and first-prize winner of the recent virtual Washington International Competition, in the first Nagle Recital since 2017! Two hundred and two enthusiastic, vaccinated audience members streamed into the Terrace Theater of the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts on Sunday, November 21, 2021, for this in-person event. And what an exciting concert it was. Vivian's demanding and delightful program of Bach, Ravel, Scriabin, and Prokofiev brought the engaged audience to their feet in a standing ovation. As winner of the audience prize in the WIC Piano competition, this outstanding, promising artist treated the audience to an encore of the witty Finale: Presto movement of Haydn's Sonata in E-flat major, Hob. XVI/46. She continues her studies in Tel Aviv with Arie Vardi, working towards an Artist Diploma.

This event would not have been successful without the assistance and cooperation of FMMC Foundation board members Lois Jones, who hosted Vivian during her stay in DC, and Junko Takahashi, Simon Finlow, and Jennie Weyman, our FMMC Managing Director, who managed the distribution of tickets for the concert. Thank you all for your invaluable contribution.

The application deadline for the Johansen International Competition for Young String Players closed on December 1, 2021. The




preliminary judging process will result in the selection of semifinalists in violin, viola, and cello. We look forward to welcoming them to Washington DC from March 21 through 24, 2022. Plan to attend the semifinals and finals to support these young competitors at the start of their musical careers. Past winners of this prestigious competition continue to excel, gaining top prizes in major international string competitions, as members of top-tier orchestras around the world, and establishing successful careers in the performance field.

The Chairs of the 2022 Washington International Competitions for Strings and Composition are busy fielding inquiries and applications from interested contestants and we anticipate exciting competitions next May 27-29, 2022. Winners will receive significant monetary prize awards in addition to the loan of outstanding instruments donated by renowned French luthier, Christophe Landon Rare Violins.

I would like to take the opportunity to wish you a very Happy New Year 2022, filled with joy, the promise of better times ahead, good health and a productive year sharing music together. I am humbled to serve as the FMMC Foundation Director, working alongside a board of dedicated volunteers, and look forward to our continued collaboration. It is my hope that we will successfully navigate these trying times as we continue to promote our meaningful competitions and support our talented contestants. Our upcoming international competitions always need lots of helping hands to enable things to run smoothly. Serving as a host for one of the competitors provides an amazing opportunity to experience first-hand the talent and dedication of these young musicians. Stays are a few days in length—a quiet place to practice and prepare before they compete is always a must. Additionally, door monitors and attendants are needed at the actual competition venues themselves. Contact Judy Silverman or Harriet Kaplan to be placed on a list to help with the Johansen International Competition, taking place March 21-24.



The Washington International Competition, scheduled for May 27-29, will need even more hosts than usual this year, to accommodate all 30 string semifinalists who will need places to stay. Help on the days of the competition is also crucial. To express an interest in any of these options, please contact our Foundation Director Grace McFarlane.

Finally, as long-term and senior care facilities begin to open, we will be able to restart our Outreach program. If you are interested in participating when the opportunity arises, contact Joanna Taylor.
