Seems like most of us have experienced deja vu over the past few months. Just when we think our lives could be almost normal, along comes another variant that curtails our activities yet again.

Call me cautiously optimistic but I cannot help but anticipate better days ahead. One technique I have found helpful to get through these sometimes draggy days is to prepare for special and exciting events ahead. There are two in particular I want to share with you as they both relate directly to the FMMC. The first is the joint performance by our Avanti Orchestra and our Arioso Chorale of the Brahms Requiem, which will be on Saturday, April 30 at 7:30 PM at the Montgomery College Performing Arts Center in Silver Spring. The second is the oft-postponed, but now again rescheduled, Arioso tour and participation in the Amalfi Coast Music Festival in Maiori, Italy, which will take place from Tuesday, June 28, to Tuesday, July 5.

To begin locally, we hope many of you will join us for the Brahms performance. This is a perfect repertoire choice to celebrate the end of our 135th year, as well as to memorialize those we have lost over the course of the past two years. Our combined Avanti and Arioso forces will be joined by the Montgomery College Chorus, as well as two most outstanding soloists, Annie Schwartz, soprano, and Javier Arrey, baritone. Both Annie and Javier have sung in previous FMMC concerts, and we are excited to have them with us again. This concert provides a perfect opportunity to show appreciation for our loyal membership. Stay tuned for further details as they become available.

Registration is still open for participation in the Amalfi Coast Festival tour. The program repertoire will include two concert performances: The first is Paul Leavitt's emotionally stirring Requiem with orchestra, and the second a July 4th, themed concert. Rehearsals for participants will begin on Wednesday, May 4th and there will be two local Bon Voyage performances on June 16th and 18th. The week includes extensive touring opportunities in this beautiful area, as well as optional travel to Rome with an optional stay there. You do not need to be a member of the Chorale to participate.

The contestants' names will be announced in early March. Plans for the May 27–29, 2022, competition will then kick into high gear. Stay tuned.

The judges for the WIC Composition Competition are evaluating the applicants' submissions. Mark Simon, WIC Composition Chair, will announce the results by April 1.

First and foremost, I am relieved to see case counts in the DC area decrease significantly and quickly this past month. Although we could have presented several of our concerts safely in February, we felt it was safest to postpone live events until we saw what would happen with pandemic conditions. We are hopeful that activity will resume in March.

In the meantime, I am pleased that we could record a Virtual Chamber Concert in person this past month, albeit without an audience and with expanded safety precautions in place (including rapid testing). The performance premiered on Friday, February 25 at 12 noon on our YouTube Channel (fmmc.org/youtube), and featured performances by several determined members of both our Chamber Program and Composers Group, who met in mid-February to present this music. It took a great deal of logistics to make it possible to record this concert despite the circumstances, so I am grateful to them for their flexibility and enthusiasm.

rioso Chorale went back to work in October to prepare for a fourconcert performance of Bach's St. Matthew Passion. This work calls for double everything - two orchestras, two n ruses, two sets of soloists, and enough mat ria t na two different ninetyminute cover s. 1 s such the Chorale will perform each mayor at the cover the course of two weeks start go ait! Part 1 on Thursday, March 3, and Saccardy, March 5. The second part of the work will be performed on Thursday, March 10, and Saturday, March 12. All four concerts will start at 8:00 PM in the Sanctuary of the Church of the Reformation (212 E. Capitol Street, NW). Proof of vaccination status will be checked at the entrance and masks will be required.

As soon as the Chorale has completed the performances of the Bach, it will turn its attention to preparing the Brahms Requiem, one of the more popular choral and audience favorites, and will perform this work in a joint concert with Avanti on Friday, April 29. The first rehearsal for this effort will be on Sunday, March 20 starting at 1:30 PM taking place at the Church of the Reformation (212 E. Capitol St., NW). Street parking is available in the area and the nearest Metro stop is Capitol South on the Orange, Blue and Silver lines.
