April will feature an interesting mix of French choral works, including an unusual piece by Lili Boulanger and music of Fauré and Poulenc


Meanwhile. in March we look forward to the third concert of the Avanti Leslie Luxemburg Orchestra in their year-long quest for a new

Mia Chung, pianist and artist teacher, will present the next master class for FMMC. The session will take place Monday, April 8th, at the University of Maryland International Piano Archives in the Clarice Smith Center for the Performing Arts. The session will take place from 10:00 am until noon. Three pianists will perform.

Ms. Chung has enjoyed international success as recitalist, concert pianist, and chamber musician. She won First Prize in the Concert Artists Guild Competition and received an Avery Fisher Career Grant. A professor of Musical Studies and Performance at the Curtis Institute in Philadelphia, she has performed extensively in North America, Europe, Asia, and Central America. A magna cum laude graduate of Harvard College, her master's degree is from Yale University and her doctorate from the Juilliard School, where she studied with Peter Serkin. Her CD and DVD recordings have earned high praise and awards.

Marta has long experience as a student, professional violist and teacher, and as an FMMC member. She grew up nurtured by a group of unforgettable mentors in snowy Duluth, Minnesota, but her curiosity kept pushing her East and South. Music degrees from the Universities of Wisconsin and Iowa, and the music schools at Interlochen and Manhattan, plus the usual Big Summer Music Festivals led her down a winding path (with a husband who took a job nearby!) through Cleveland and New Jersey to the Washington DC area and a varied career of teaching, coaching, and performing on modern and baroque viola, a little viola da gamba, and a little violin, too. Aside from an annual flurry of chamber music concerts with the Assisi Performing Arts festival in Umbria, Italy, she is currently a regular player with the Washington Bach Consort, the North Carolina Baroque Orchestra, Bach Akademie Charlotte, and the Virginia Chamber Orchestra, to name a few. A home studio of enthusiastic high schoolers and an adjunct spot on the faculty of Sheridan College in Wyoming keep her on her toes, tailoring new and familiar repertoire to the individual student.

In the Club, Marta serves as First Vice President of the Board of Governors, the Auditions Chair. That involves setting up live auditions for those who wish to become Performance Members of the Club, and also fielding the numerous virtual auditions that are submitted throughout the year. She has performed many times on chamber concerts and with Avanti, and has also served as a preliminary judge for the Johansen International Competition for Strings. Marta previously served on the Friday Morning Music Club Foundation Board of Trustees. Balancing such a cobbledtogether career made her a reluctant joiner in the past, but the FMMC is truly worthwhile! She reports that "the array of skills among the volunteers is wondrous, and knowing they are almost all musicians who understand and support what we all like to do best makes for a warm, welcoming and effective atmosphere."
