Arioso Chorale: January Concerts Soloists Announced

rioso will present its next concerts on January 25 and January 27, 2024, and will feature a work that was very popular 100 years ago but is rarely heard today. Samuel Coleridge-Taylor's *The Song of Hiawatha*, consisting of three cantatas that follow an overture, was first performed in 1898 and was regularly (if not annually) performed in London for over 30 years.

When performed in its entirety, the whole work runs nearly three hours in length. Therefore, we have selectively

adjusted the music to be performed while keeping much of the story line intact. In making our adjustments, we have ensured that our soloists, soprano Jennifer Cho, tenor Allan Palacios Chan, and bass/baritone Diego Matamoros, will have the opportunity to demonstrate their prowess.

The other work on this program, sung by the Arioso Chamber Singers, is John Corigliano's *Fern Hill*. With a text drawn from a poem by Dylan Thomas, this work was first performed in 1961. Over the years Mr. Corigliano has updated the work to the current version from 1999. The Mezzo-Soprano solo will be sung by Sanchi Jayaram, who is a member of the Chorale.

The Chorale and orchestra will present this concert on the evenings of January 25 and January 27 beginning at 8:00 PM in the Sanctuary of the Church of the Reformation (212 E. Capitol St., NE). As always, the concerts are free and open to the public. Contributions to help defray costs are gratefully accepted. Additional details will be posted on the FMMC website (finmc.org). We hope to see you there.

Both concerts will start at 3:00 PM and will take place in the Ballroom Backroom at Glen Echo Park. I hope to see you there.


