Highlights of the October FMMC Board Meeting

In the President's report, Albert emphasized once again that FMMC is faced with many difficult decisions involving finances, volunteers, membership, and the future, and encouraged additional volunteer support. He also reported that the Board will hold a retreat during the afternoon of January 18, 2026, with the objective to foster the feeling of community among the Board and build a consensus on decisions.

Outreach: most dates between January and May have been set, and the dates and locations are now online. Interested members can sign up through FMMC's subscription to SignUpGenius.

Avanti: Melody Lin has joined as the orchestra's librarian. She has extensive experience as an orchestral librarian, having worked with a handful of orchestras in New York. Melody is also an accomplished violinist and will be a wonderful benefit to Avanti. Conductor Chi-Yuan Lin recently met with Albert, Laila Linden, and Anne Zim concerning a potential collaboration between Avanti and the Taipei Economic and Cultural Representative Office (TECRO). She prepared a preliminary budget and proposal for TECRO with two concerts highlighting Taiwanese soloists and composers in 2026. TECRO would provide partial financial support for the performances (between 25% and 35%). Approval is expected in the first quarter of 2026.

Public Relations: Lydia is working to bring on an intern to assist, and will soon approach colleges with arts management programs to search for someone. Regarding rebranding, there was more extensive discussion on rebranding of the FMMC name, but no specific decision was made. Input from the FMMC community is welcome.

Foundation: fundraising for the Foundation will no longer pass through the Club, and instead, donations will go directly to the Foundation. The Club, however, does receive money from the Foundation, as it contributes 15% of the operating costs and some costs of the Avanti concert when it features a WIC winner.

Arioso: Great Performances This Fall; Our Next Concerts in Mid-Winter

n October 30 and again on November 2, the Arioso Chorale and its orchestra entertained a combined audience of about 180 attendees in its first concert set of the 2025–2026 season. Playing works by Josef Rheinberger and Felix Mendelssohn, the 38 singers and 35 orchestra members delivered a solid performance which, on the November 2 performance, was livestreamed. The live-stream feed is available on YouTube at Arioso Chorale and Orchestra – Mendelssohn and Rheinberger. The video has been viewed by over 260 people to date.

Arioso is planning its next concert for mid-winter (Feb. 26 and Mar. 1). The principal work on the program will be Paul Leavitt's *Magnificat*. Arioso last performed this work in 2015, the second season under Paul's direction. Additional works are still under discussion. The first chorus rehearsal for the February concert will be on Sunday, January 4, 2026, and the first orchestra rehearsal will be on Monday, January 5. Rehearsals and the concert performances will be at the Lutheran Church of the Reformation (212 E. Capitol St, NE). For further information, please contact Peter Baum at chorale@fmmc.org. The program for the third concert in this year's season has not been decided at this time. The third and final concert is scheduled for Thursday, April 30 (8:00 PM) and Sunday, May 3 (4:00 PM).

hange is afoot! Albert Hunt wrote in his President's column last month about the Club considering the use of the initials FMMC as the public form of the name. The Foundation is also considering changes in how we present ourselves, moving towards using Washington International Competition (WIC) and Johansen International Competition (JIC) as the primary identifiers that the public sees, with the FMMC Foundation name much more in the background. We hope that this would help make our different missions and activities clearer to members, donors and the public.

A related change has already taken place which you may notice if you are used to including donations to the WIC and JIC in your annual FMMC giving. The competitions have been removed from the Club donation page and now appear on the Foundation website, fimmcfoundation.org, where donations go directly to the Foundation account. This does require an additional step if you wish to support both organizations (and I hope you will!), but it means Club administrators no longer need to track and pass along the Foundation's donations, and donors should be clear as to exactly what their donations on each website are and are not supporting.

But some things are not changing, and it is once again that exciting time of year when applications have begun coming in for next spring's competition. Once again, we get to be wowed by the level of talent and artistry in the current crop of young musicians. The huge potential in the students and young professionals that we encounter every year is always extremely clear. It is a privilege to play a small part in helping that potential to blossom. We do hope you'll join us in that by donating if you're able, by volunteering during the competition in May, by spreading the word to young singers you may know, or simply by attending as an audience member to hear these remarkable musicians in person. Johansen International Competition: Where Are They Now? Ella Park

lla Eunsuh Park, a JIC 2025 viola semi-finalist from South Korea, illustrates the value of the IIC in early career development. Ella is an exciting young artist with significant accomplishments already under her belt. Since 2015, she has garnered multiple first prizes at major Korean competitions, including the Ewha Kyunghyang Concours (2019), the 23rd Strad Competition, and the Kwon Hyukjoo Music Competition (2023). She also advanced to the grand finale of the Seongjeong Music Competition and had the opportunity to perform with the orchestra. At the age of eleven, she made her orchestral debut with the Suwon Philharmonic Orchestra, and in 2019, she gave her first solo recital at Kumho Art Hall. She is currently studying with Jihye Hong at the Korea National University of Arts.

I was one of Ella's hosts during the competition and she graciously answered some questions about her JIC experience and other aspects of her musical life and life outside of music.

Are there memories of your JIC experience that you feel helped shape your participation in other competitions and/or career plans?

During the JIC Competition period, I had the privilege of staying with wonderful host families. Living briefly alongside them, away from my parents, they were incredibly warm-hearted, and they made sure I had a comfortable and welcoming environment, so I was able to spend that time in the best way possible. What remains in my memory from the competition is not the result, but the warmth of the families, the conversations we shared, and the feeling of being part of another

loving home. I distinctly remember the day one of the grandmothers suggested we put the practicing aside for a moment and take a walk around the neighborhood. That spontaneous walk proved to be a more meaningful moment than any time spent on rehearsal. Realizing that a competition could give me memories like these regardless of the outcome gave me the courage to try again. I want to extend my most heartfelt gratitude to my host families (Jeanne, Deborah & Neal). They have fundamentally shifted my perspective and given me such a precious gift.

Did learning the contemporary piece affect your attitude towards contemporary music?

For me, contemporary music used to feel difficult to even approach. I assumed it would be hard to find a story within the music or to relate to it emotionally. But once I actually began working on it, I realized that wasn't the case at all. The unique shapes of sounds that the composers sought to express are actually fascinating, and the process of learning the techniques and understanding the intonation required to express them has been incredibly meaningful. It was genuinely enjoyable to discover new meanings in certain intervals or phrases that another performer had approached differently. Through this experience, I came to understand the unique charm of contemporary music that is distinct from earlier periods.

What is your favorite piece you're currently working on?

Recently, I have been working on Hindemith's Viola Sonata, Op. 11 No. 4, a piece I had long hoped to study.

Hindemith, a composer of the early 20th century, does not reject traditional form or tonality outright, but instead weaves them together with the harmonic language and sound colors of his time. There are so many fascinating elements in this work—the free, fantasy-like flow of ideas, the folk song phrases, and the way a single theme continues to transform throughout the piece. The reason I love this piece is the third movement. Even amid the quick harmonic changes, there is a brief, clear moment that feels very sincere, and I'm always struck by it. The more I study this piece, the more I discover.

What hobbies do you enjoy outside of music?

Outside of music, I enjoy table tennis and photography. I first learned table tennis from my Dad and later joined a school team, eventually winning first place in a competition. Since then, I've enjoyed playing casually. I also like taking photos, particularly of the atmosphere of different places.
